3. Discussion

- a. Local Rule 9013-1(c): Discussion on feedback from Chambers regarding the current requirement to admit or deny each allegation included in a motion.

- b. Local Rule 4001-1(b)(1) and Local Form 6: Subcommittee of Steve Morrell and Kellie Fisher reported on their review of Local Form 6.
 - Matter to be continued to next meeting; further discussion is needed among the Subcommittee.
- c. Local Rule 9010-1(b): Subcommittee of Steve Morrell and Jen Hayden reported on their look into whether the committee should change "permitted" to "prohibited."
 - Discussion on language proposed by the Subcommittee. Nate Hull will work with Monica Bigley to insert proposed language into Local Rule 9010-1(b) in the master redline for the Committee to review.
